BLOG OR WIKI?

Which you should use depends on what you want to do with it. If you want to have students working individually on projects, posting data and replying to other students' posts, you probably want a blog. Although you could still do this with a wiki, it would probably be easier with a blog.

If, however, you want students to post group projects and work collaboratively, you probably would rather use a wiki.

Edublogs Secure student blogs. Should be allowed by school filters because it only hosts educational content. www.edublogs.com	\$39.95/year for an Educator Pro account which then allows students to have free accounts.	Blogs are archived, but only teacher can access them.	Teacher controls the privacy options of student blogs.		
Word Press http://wordpress.com (www.wordpress.org) - This is a download. Recommended for home use only.	FREE, but with premium upgrades available	Students keep blogs.	Secure
